

The Rajasthani Foundation – Guidelines for Selection of Charities

The Board of The Rajasthani Foundation ('TRF') requires the Charity Selection Committee to follow the below guidelines for selection for Charities to be funded by TRF.

- The charity should be established and registered in Rajasthan under the relevant laws
- The charity should be professionally managed .i.e. should not be a family owned or managed organisation
- All the assets of the charity including land and building should be in the legal ownership of the charity
- The members of the charity should be providing voluntarily services only .i.e. should not be drawing any monetary or non-monetary benefit, directly or indirectly, through the charity
- Managing Committee/Board of Trustees should not draw any monetary or non-monetary benefit including remuneration or profits, directly or indirectly through the charity
- The purpose of the charity i.e. the work done should be in Rajasthan and for the people of Rajasthan
- The objectives of the charity should not be limited .i.e. the charity should aim to expand in the foreseeable future
- The primary objective of the charity should be rehabilitation of the people it serves and make them financially independent in the long run.

Members of TRF are welcome to put forward and suggest any notable charities that could benefit from funds generated through TRF fund raising activities provided they meet the charity selection criteria.

The Board of TRF would have final authority to accept or reject any application based on the above guidelines.

The above guidelines are subject to annual review or review on any material change.
